*Teachers of the **Kelenvölgyi Elementary School** began to ground the school inclusion for 10 years. At first there were only 2 devoted colleagues, today is evident for the whole staff to organize a program on International Parasport Day. Nikolett and Katalin will talk about the daily practice in an inclusive school and specifically about the senzitisation and awareness raising among children - related to disability.

The **Hand In Hand Foundation in Hungary has been working since 1993 for a tolerant society, in which people with disability can live with dignity. For this purpose, we begin awareness raising at an early stage: among children in kindergartens and schools. To support teachers and child care professionals in their daily work, we set up a highly developed and interactive program for them, called KÉP. We introduce the steps and elements of this complex awareness raising program.
